### STUDY LEAVE

Study Leave for Year 13 students will begin on **Monday 4th June**. There will be timetabled support for students available during the study leave period – for Mathematics, teachers will be available in Brahmagupta, for Physics and Computer Science support will be available during the times that students would normally have had their lessons.

## AWARDS, COMPETITIONS & ACTIVITIES

### English Speaking Board (ESB):

On 20<sup>th</sup> April 15 of our year 13 students took the English Speaking Board Level 3 Certificate in Graded Examination in Speech, Senior Proficiency Grade 6. We had two examiners who presided over two groups through the morning. Each student gave three short talks to their group: a presentation on a technical subject, a poem or piece of prose, and a review. They also took part in discussions on each piece and asked questions of each other.

The students really impressed the examiners with their involvement, their level of understanding of their subjects and their support of each other. The possible outcomes for this examination are Pass, Good Pass, Merit, Merit Plus and Distinction. All of our students passed with at least Merit and 5 of them gained Distinction. The students concerned were self-selected volunteers who have been coming to occasional lunchtime sessions through the year to prepare and they all deserve an enormous pat on the back for their bravery in taking part in a somewhat experimental trial run with no one but mathematicians to advise them.

### National Chess Finals:

On the 25<sup>th</sup> April a chess team of 4 EMS students went to Imperial College London to play in the National Finals of the UK Team Chess Challenge. There were teams from as far and wide as Torquay and Glasgow competing. As a team, the EMS students came 6<sup>th</sup> overall. This was a great success given that, due to train delays, the team were late for the start of the competition and were therefore unable to gain any points for the first round. Reece Whittington, on board 1, got 2.5/4 against very tough opponents including a game against a player with a grade of 200 ECF, when his is only 140. Yannis Wells, on board 4, also played extremely well achieving 3.5/4. Credit also goes to Jake Corbett and Reece White, on boards 2 and 3 respectively, for playing very well against very tough competition.

### Exeter College rugby team represent England in Japan:

EMS Year 13 student, Sam Rose, was a member of the Exeter Chiefs Rugby Academy at Exeter College who represented England at a prestigious international tournament in Japan from April 29<sup>th</sup> to May 6<sup>th</sup>. The Sanix World Rugby Youth Invitational tournament was hosted by the Japan Rugby Football Union at the Global Arena on the island of Kyūshū. Exeter College's team was the only UK college, or school, team to take part in this prestigious event, described as the pinnacle of the sport for schoolboy rugby. Participation is by invitation only with the overseas schools selected by their respective unions to represent their country. The team played some great rugby and were very pleased to finish 9<sup>th</sup> in the world, winning the plate final – best of the rest.
